After graduation, he started a career in the masonry industry, working with Frank Galante & Son. In 1988, he joined the Bricklayers Union and became Union Organizer in 1990. Mr. Tolson is currently the Director of the Bricklayers Union for the state of New Jersey, a position he has held since 2006.

In 2012, Mr. Tolson received his Bachelor's degree in Labor Studies from the National Labor College in Silver Springs, Maryland. He is very committed to community engagement throughout South Jersey. He has served on the New Jersey Economic Development Authority for seven years. He currently serves as the Vice Chairman of the Casino Reinvestment Development Authority. His strong ties to the Black community in Ocean City originated in his relationship with the Ocean City Hawks Organization. Mr. Tolson coached Hawks teams from 1984-1992, and again in 2000.
